

On May 29th, you will be joining hundreds of other walkers to raise funds in order to help children with Sickle Cell Disease attend camp. Sickle Cell Disease is a life-threatening genetic blood disorder that affects the quality of everyday life. There is no cure. Established in 1994, **Camp Jumoke** has been sending children with SCD to summer camp for two weeks each summer. It costs over \$1,750 to send each child to camp. Your contribution will help these children to experience organized camping and to develop friendships, self-confidence and memories that will last a lifetime. Please read the following information carefully to learn our story and how you can help.

TURTLE WALK 2010

The **Turtle Walk** follows a 6 km route starting and ending at **Queen's Park** North Entrance (University and Museum). The walk will begin at noon. The registration tables will open at 10:00 a.m. You can walk at your own pace through the streets of downtown Toronto with marshals along the route for your safety. When you return to the park, get ready for a family-friendly afternoon of entertainment and food! Participating in the **Turtle Walk** is a wonderful way to spend your day.

COLLECTING PLEDGES

Collecting pledges can be fun and is easier than you might think. Start with your friends and family. Then ask your neighbours. Then ask your co-workers. Please note that the pledge is for the entire walk, so your sponsors can pay when they pledge. This saves you from having to collect money later, and it makes you eligible for the prizes awarded to the day's top fundraisers! Please ensure that all pledge information is written in ink and is legible and complete. Eligible pledges will be tax receipted.

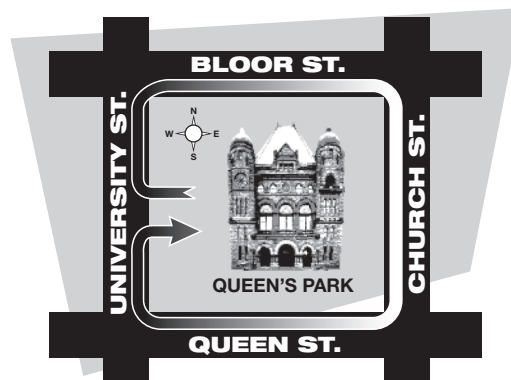
SUBMITTING PLEDGES

6km ROUTE

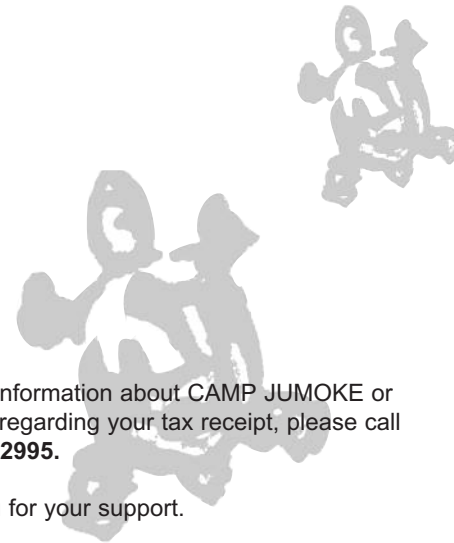

THE SPIRIT OF SURVIVAL

"**Jumoke**" is a Nigerian word that means, "Everyone loves the child." Since our second year of operation, the turtle has been our symbol. The turtle lives longer than any other animal except man. In ancient cultures, the turtle was revered as a symbol of strength, survival and perseverance; some cultures also believed that turtles possessed mystical healing powers. In nature, only the strong survive, and the turtle does this best. For these reasons, **Camp Jumoke** has chosen the turtle as a symbol of the struggle and strength of all of our children, especially those afflicted with Sickle Cell Disease.
